### **Summary of Comments:**

Further comments have been received from a local resident who expresses concerns relating to contaminated land, surface water drainage, allocation of the land for a community park and highlights an objection from Network Rail. Reference is also made to applications in 2002 for the site that were withdrawn due to concerns relating to the matters raised above.

### **Officer Response:**

The committee reports addresses matters relating to drainage, land contamination and the objection from Network Rail. It is noted that applications in 2002 were withdrawn, however these related to a much larger site which included proposals for 200 dwellings, a school, golf club open space and a surgery. It is pertinent to note that since the withdrawal of the applications referred to, the large majority of the site subject to the 2002 applications has been developed. In any event, every application is judged on its own merits and in this case the proposal is considered acceptable subject to conditions.

Comments relating to the community park have been noted, however no reference to this has been identified in the withdrawn applications. Notwithstanding this, the application site is privately owned and has no allocation for retail or community use, is being considered under the adopted LDP and considered acceptable under the relevant policies.

Surface Water Drainage Strategy (Welsh Water)

I have contacted Welsh Water re the above application. They responded that the surface water drainage serving the above application site will not be allowed to be connected to the main sewer!

All surface water drainage systems serving Rhoose Point have positive connections, (brownfield site) no soakaways. As I understand it, the above site is contaminated. (See report)

The Environmental Agency/NRW should be consulted. The above site is also adjacent to a Waste Management Licensed asbestos area. (Matters discussed with Case Officer)

Level Crossing Road (Network Rail Asset) not adopted by the Council

Network Rail has raised an objection to the above application site (2018/01421/OUT - read Council comments - report)

2018/01421/OUT Site History

It would be in your interest to obtain a copy of the original access/design statement to include subsequent amendments dated 17/05/2000. The site was intended for use as a community park for the Rhoose Point residents. (Council planning report - assertion made with regards to your objections re previous application use as a retail site etc.)

Karen Gallimore and I submitted objections to the Council dated November 2005 re the above site previous planning application.

- Objections - Access, drainage of the site, including environmental issues

Letters were handed to each member of the planning committee on closure of their site meeting.

Committee decision - application deferred for further information, subsequently withdrawn.

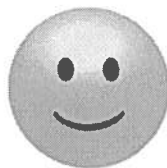

**Summary of Comments:**

In four letters of representation, members of the public (and, in one case, their legal representatives) suggest that:

- The proposed planning unit includes agricultural land;
- The proposal would harm neighbours' residential amenity (e.g. loss of privacy, loss of outlook, loss of peace and quiet, effect of glare from car headlights and ambient light);
- Contrary to claims made in the application documents, the applicants did not consult neighbours before submitting the application;
- The application has been submitted in the name of one person, even though two persons appear to own the property;
- The proposal would harm the character and appearance of the site and its surroundings (which include a Special Landscape Area);
- The applicants propose to remove sections of hedgerows which do not belong to them;
- Planning history from the 1980s shows that part of the application site belongs to the owners of Whitewells Farm;
- The application should be deemed invalid because Certificate B of the application has not been signed;
- The planning authority has ignored representations about land ownership, and the planning officer has 'simply accepted the information from the applicants and their Agents';
- The application documents lack volumetric information and plans which directly compare the elevations of the existing bungalow and the elevations of the proposed house;
- Being near the site's north-western boundary, from which sections of hedgerow would be removed, the proposed garage and the proposed gym would be too prominent in the landscape.

**Officer Response:**

The recent letters of representation do not raise any new material planning considerations. Officers have considered all of the planning issues in the formal assessment of the development proposal.

In one letter of representation, it is suggested that the proposed gym (near the site's north-western boundary) would be 4.8 metres tall at the top of its flat roof. However, measurements taken from the application documents indicate that the flat roof would be only 3.5 to 3.6 metres above ground level.

We act for Mr & Mrs Ginn of Whitewells Farm, Peterston Super Ely CF5 6NE.

We write in relation to the planning application referenced 2019/00796/ and its planned affect upon our clients' property. The proposed planning documentation currently affords for the removal of part of the field hedge that lies within our clients' property.

Our clients' boundary can be clearly seen on the attached Promap document, upon which the land registry title plans have been superimposed. You will note that the boundary runs closely behind the garage, tapering in towards the front where it meets the edge of the entrance gate pillar of the Meadows.

The boundary between our clients' property and that of the Applicant, adjacent to the existing annex, is also detailed on the 1985 (ref: 1985/00658) and 1988 (ref: 1988/00215) planning applications made by the previous owners of The Meadows. Both the applications and the land registry documents show that the field hedge planned for removal is within our client's ownership.


We understand that the Applicant and planning officer have referred to the 1985 and 1988 planning documents and so must be aware of their content. Despite this, the ownership plans submitted by the Applicant have not been amended to reflect the aforementioned information, nor have they been queried by the planning officer.

Our clients do not consent to this proposed removal of the hedge / trespass onto their property and require the planning documentation to be appropriately altered.

Further, the Applicants or their agents did not seek to consult with our clients prior to making the application nor has a certificate B been served upon our clients. The planning application cannot be deemed to be valid until the relevant documentation has been served upon our clients.

We are conscious that the planning committee is to meet to discuss this application on 20<sup>th</sup> November 2019 and would be grateful if the serious issues raised in this letter could be brought to their attention urgently.

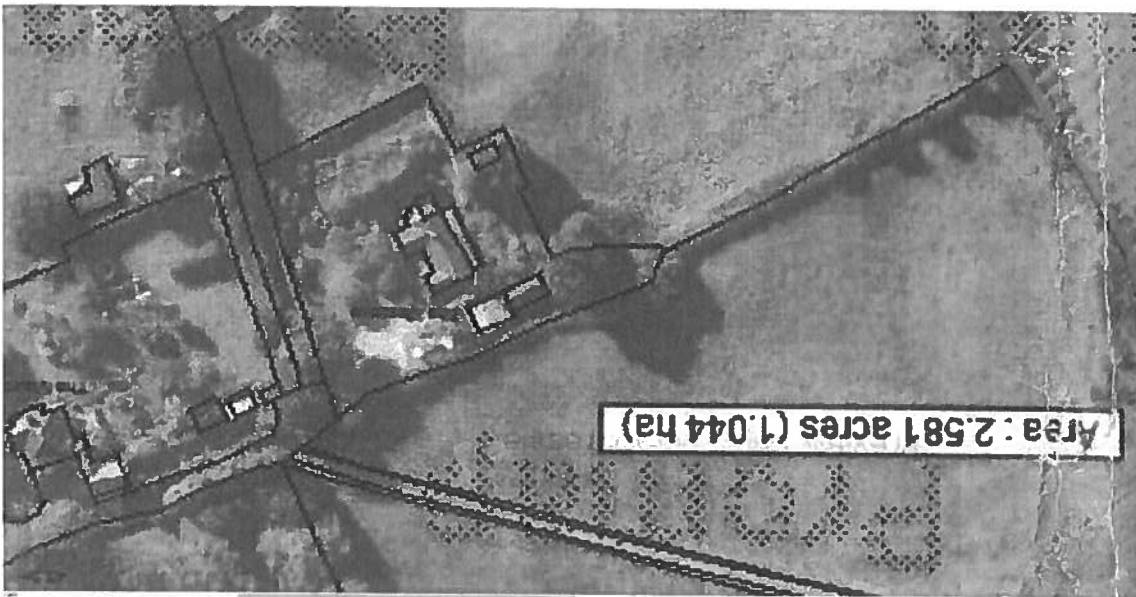

**Planning Application 2019/00796/FUL  
The Meadows, Peterston Super Ely**

We refer to our letters of 29 August 2019 and 14 October 2019 objecting to the above.

We also refer to our email of 4 November to Mr Mark Stringer, following our discussions with him of 1 November and his response of 5 November, in relation to the documents uploaded onto the planning portal on 25 and 30 October 2019

We consider that it is extremely unfair and unjust that, despite our request, we have not been given proper time to consider these revised documents properly in order to make our representations to the Planning Department. Such representations on these new documents should have been fully considered by the Planning Department prior to any Report being prepared by the Planning Officer for Committee.

The proposal has a great impact on the Landscape and our property and has caused considerable stress with the limited timescale. Furthermore we are still unable to download and open the revised Design and Access Statement on any computers using windows software, although it can be opened on a phone.

We have made numerous representations to the Planning Officer about the incorrect land ownership plans and our boundary and the encroachment of the proposed development onto our property. These have been ignored to date as the Planning Officer has simply accepted the information from the applicants and their Agents.

Solicitors are involved and have written both to the Applicants and to the Council Planning Department. A copy of the letter of 14 November 2019 to the Planning Department from Abrahams Dresden is attached for the members information

The applicants have made a error in their topographical survey as they have taken their boundary as being on the line of our entrance gates. Our entrance gates were set back some six years ago when the bund and field hedge that formed part of our boundary were removed to try to resolve the surface water discharging onto our entrance in heavy rains. We are now in the process of reinstating that line to its correct position.

The planning documents relating to the 1985 and 1988 planning applications at The Meadows, are referred to by both the Applicant and the Planning Officer. The plans accompanying these applications clearly show the boundary fence adjacent to the annex building. Despite this, the ownership plans submitted by the Applicant have not been amended to reflect the aforementioned information, nor have they been queried by the planning officer.

We feel that it is completely wrong that Prospero Planning and the applicants have not been fully open and amended their position over the boundary in full knowledge of the information on the 1985 and 1988 applications. We are also surprised that this was not queried by the Planning Officer.

**In the knowledge of these plans, the applicants and their Agents should have either altered their proposals or served us with a Certificate B Notice. The lack of the appropriate certificate should render their application invalid.**

The applicants and their Agents are being selective in using these plans to make a claim for a larger residential curtilage, extending into the agricultural field, but not to acknowledge the correct position of the boundaries.

The fact of the matter is that the proposed scheme (**3 story house, triple garage, gymnasium and swimming pool**) is too big for a site of only 0.2 hectares and that is why they are seeking to encroach into the agricultural field, onto neighbouring property as well as destroying the countryside features of trees and hedges that make up the Special Landscape Area.

**Our objection to the proposal stands in its entirety.**

In our previous letters we stated that drawings be provided to show proposed against existing elevations of all buildings in order to consider the massing and impact of the proposed development.

This information was also requested in the pre application letter, from The Planning Department, **'I would ask that any full application is supported by a plan showing the elevations of the existing dwelling in outline in order to assess the massing and impacts of th replacement dwelling against the existing dwelling'**. We are surprised and concerned that the Planning Officer has not insisted that these drawings be provided by the applicants together with volumetric calculations. Only this information will truly show the increase in size and scale of the proposed compared to the existing.



The photographs below have been taken in an attempt to show the Planning Committee how the height of just the ancillary buildings will be dominant in the landscape, especially when the hedges and trees are removed

The height of the new garage and gym will both be 4.8 m high ( information provided by the Planning Officer), The garage has a shallow pitched roof while the gym has a flat roof.

We took a pole of 4.8metres and then held it up against the hedge in the positions of the proposed garage and gym. You will note that they dwarf the existing garage and annex which have a ridge height of below 3metres.

The height of these new buildings appear to be the same height as the chimneys of the existing bungalow,

The proposal is to remove our field hedge, which we have recently cut (our hedges are cut annually in late October or November. We will not allow this It will be impossible for the applicants to screen the development as even if there was no boundary dispute there is only 15 to 20 cm between the hedge and the edge of the field.

The pole of 4.8m shows the height of the proposed garage at the start. Note that it is almost double the height of the field hedge which the applicants propose to remove in its entirety. The rear wall of the garage will be within 20cm of where the pole has been placed. The applicants own no land on which replacement hedges or trees can be planted to screen these buildings in the landscape

The pole of 4.8m shows the height of the proposed garage at far end. Note that it is almost double the height of the field hedge and the same height of the internal laurel hedge, both of which the applicants propose to remove. The rear **wall** of the garage will be dominant in the landscape it will be in line with the field hedge as the applicants have no land on which they can plant any replacement hedges or trees.

Taken in the same position as photo 2 above, but from a different angle. This shows how much higher the proposed garage is compared to the ridge height of the annex, visible in the picture.

As before, both the laurel and our field hedge will be removed, to which we do not consent. The rear **wall** of the garage will be visible and dominant in the landscape as it is to be built on the field edge. The applicants own no land adjoining on which they can plant a replacement hedge and/or trees to screen the development from the footpath and in the wider SLA

Note that it is almost double the height of the flat roof of the annex and as high or higher than the chimneys of the existing bungalow. Once again, the applicants propose to remove the hedgerow in its entirety and the wall of the gym will be on the field edge.. The applicants own no land on which replacement hedges or trees can be planted to screen the building from the footpath and in the wider landscape

The applicants own no land on which replacement hedges or trees can be planted to screen the building in the wider landscape

As photo 6, but taken from a different angle. The pole of 4.8m shows the height of the flat roof at the end of the proposed gym. It is not higher than the pitched roof part of the annex and as high or higher than the chimneys of the existing bungalow. Once again, the applicants propose to remove the hedgerow in its entirety. The large, mature beech and birch tree that are visible in the picture are also being removed. The hills above Pendoylan can clearly be seen.

The applicants own no land on which replacement hedges or trees can be planted to screen the building in the landscape.

The gym has a flat roof and is totally inappropriate for the rural setting.



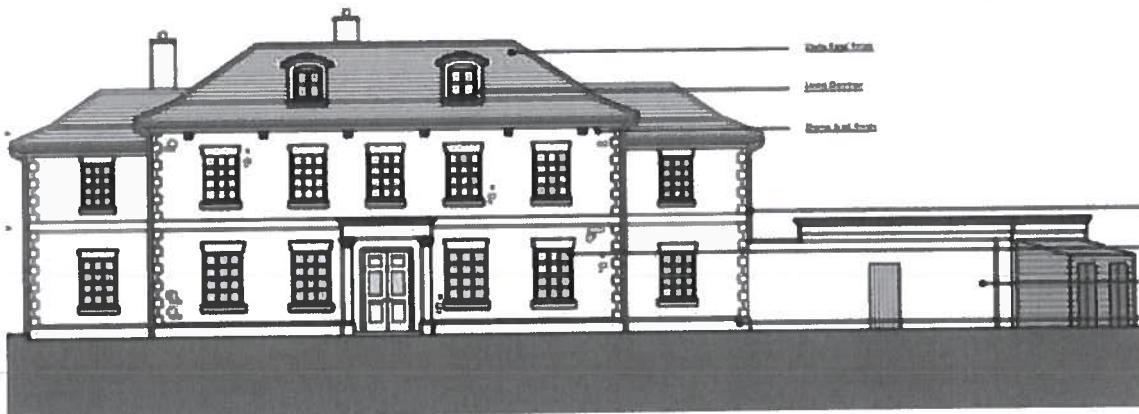


2 PROPOSED SIDE ELEVATION

This is the proposed elevation of the house from the field side. The highlighted part is the 4.8 m flat roof of the gym, the height of which we have attempted to show in photos 4 to 7 above.

It is inconceivable that one can go from a bungalow which sits well, and is barely visible in the landscape from this side, due to the surrounding hedges and trees, to this bulk of a house where no screening will be possible. This is what will be seen from the footpath.

In an effort to try to show existing against proposed elevations we have used the picture of the front elevation from the Sales Particulars and then the proposed front elevation drawing.



Note the proposed triple garage which is going to the front of the gym building has not been shown

**This will be the view from the lower footpath- the property is higher than the existing bungalow. Note the large retaining wall, compared to the hedge in front of the bungalow. (Hedge partially removed in 2018 together with the large beech tree)**

**Note also the number of steps leading down from the property, almost into the field (3 from the house and 8 from the gym) and how the levels appear to have been built up.**

**.Landscaping**

The property is in a Special Landscape Area. Features of the Special Landscape are the trees and hedges and other natural features.

As part of the proposals, around 70 metres of hedge will be removed and numerous mature trees felled in addition to those that have already been removed over the past twelve months..

The revised Planning and Design Statement at Section 2.11 on Page 12 states that the proposal will provide screening where the hedgerow is lost on the northern boundary. As mentioned above, **this is impossible** .The Planning officer informs that the rear wall of the garage will be set 2.8m behind the existing garage. The actual field is 2.96 meters behind the garage. Even if there was no dispute over the boundary, 16 cm is not big enough to plant any hedging, let alone trees to screen the development.

There is no way that the character of the site can be maintained, nor can the development blend into the landscape. The proposed development involves major destruction of the countryside.

The other properties in the locality are characterised bu substantially larger gardens, most in excess of 2 acres with mature wooded gardens, therefore sitting well in the Special Landscape Area of the Ely Valley

This is not possible with this proposed development..

**Summary**

We accept that some form of redevelopment would be appropriate for The Meadows. However, the plot is not big enough for a development ( three storey house, a gym, a triple garage and swimming pool) of this size in this Special Landscape Area. With the increase in footprint and height of the house and the associated buildings, the development will be dominant in the landscape, be highly visible from the public highway, the public footpath and in the wider scene of the SLA. It is totally inappropriate and unsympathetic for this location

We consider it contrary to Planning Policy and inconsistent with other permissions granted in the locality. We refer the Committee members to the recent planning permissions granted in the locality for the redevelopment of and/ or extensions to bungalows which are detailed in Pages 19 and 20 of our letter of 29 August 2019, a copy of which is attached for information. The Increases in ridge heights are minimal and none have been allowed to go from single to triple storey, let along with the associated huge increase in floor area.

We sincerely believe that the Planning Committee should refuse the application in its current form. It would set a precedent for overdevelopment of replacement dwellings,

residential extensions into agricultural land and significant destruction of the natural features harming the integrity of the beautiful, rural countryside and Special Landscape Areas of the Vale of Glamorgan.

In the interests of the Vale of Glamorgan and in order to allow the Committee to consider our justified concerns in respect of this application, bearing in mind the discrepancies within the plans, please would you, as a member of the Committee give your careful consideration as to whether the correct course of action should be to defer the application until the next Committee meeting when matters detailed above can be properly clarified.

**PS:** In an attempt to bring some definition to the photos above, below is a picture, taken from the public footpath with some haylage bales between the poles. Each bale is approximately 1.2m high so 4 bales high equate to 4.8metres, the height of the proposed garage and gym building. Each stack is in the approximate position of the two buildings (garage and gym) as per the proposed site layout plan. Note how the height of the proposed structure is similar in height to the existing bungalow. These buildings will be dominant and artificial in the natural environment of the SLA. The proposed house is twice the height of the outbuildings.

All the hedge that can be seen in the picture is to be removed

**Development proposal at The Meadows Peterston Super Ely – Ref 2010/00796/FUL**

I write to outline my concerns in advance of your consideration of the above application at the scheduled Planning Committee on 20<sup>th</sup> November 2019.

I am extremely concerned with the scale of the above proposal and the processing of the application referenced above.

I have lived at Dalton House since 2001 and have happily resided as an immediate neighbour of the 'The Meadows' until the extent of these redevelopment proposals has become apparent.

Whilst I believe some updating or limited redevelopment at the site could be warranted, I strongly object to the proposals before you as follows:

**Adverse effect on my residential amenity:**

The recently completed removal of hedgerows and mature trees (no consultation was entered in to on this matter) coupled with the proposed removal of further significant amounts of natural landscaping, particularly to the southern boundary of the site is completely unacceptable.

This removal of the established natural landscape exposes the previously private northern side of my property, including the pool area within the garden. The removal of the natural screen in combination with the greatly increased massing of the proposed house and outbuildings has an extremely harmful effect on the privacy and residential amenity of Dalton House, specifically on the privacy and outlook currently enjoyed from the lounge, dining room, kitchen, pool and garden area.

The removal of the existing natural landscaping together with the position of the dwelling on the plot will make the effects of noise from movements in and out of the property, together with glare from headlights and other ambient light more prevalent to both the neighbouring Dalton House and the wider landscape in which it sits.

The overbearing nature of the proposed 3 storey, 9.4m high property is in conflict with LDP Policy MD2, specifically criteria 2, 8 and 10.



### Application details and process:

The amended planning application contains information that is considered ambiguous, inaccurate and misleading with examples as follows:

- The application form confirms that neighbours had been consulted at the time of submission to the Council. This is incorrect. Dalton House was not consulted at this time, and as I understand it, nor were any other neighbours.
- The application is in the name of Mrs Katie Thomas as the sole owner of the property. The property is jointly owned by Mr and Mrs Thomas and therefore the application should have been in both names, or a Certificate B must be served on the other owner.
- False statements with regard to the use of parts of the agricultural land to the south being within the residential curtilage that the pool is proposed to be sited on. This area was always agricultural for the 18 years I have lived here. Another neighbour has confirmed to the Council, in writing, that in the 40 years that he has lived here, that land has always been agricultural. Indeed, children's play equipment has for the past 6 months been sited well within this agricultural land as in breach of this agricultural land use, however this equipment was removed yesterday.

### Effects on the character of the area:

The current dwelling and outbuildings are barely visible in the landscape. The proposal is a huge increase on the existing – the proposed garage has a height to the ridge of the roof 3m ABOVE the highest part of the roof of the car shown on the plans – why is this necessary? The existing garage measurement to ridge is 2.7m, the proposed to ridge is 4.6m.

The proposal is not compatible with the surrounding rural built and natural environment due to its scale, siting, design, and landscaping and is not supported by LDP Policy MD12.

The application is not transparent in this regard using an inconsistent scale of proposed and existing plans preventing easy comparisons to be made. To this end I requested a **volumetric** comparison to demonstrate the harmful effects as this is the only way the true massing and bulk can be assessed against the original bungalow and outbuildings. The volumetric information requested has not been forthcoming.

By virtue of its scale the proposal harms the special landscape area (SLA) by removing broadleaf trees and hedgerows that are key areas for improvement in the SLA rendering the proposal in conflict with LDP Policy MG17. Specific reference is drawn to the access lane and required removal of hedging to create enough width for access by large vehicles and emergency vehicles. The width of the track is only 3 metres, but the application states that it is 4.5 meters. This additional width can only be achieved by the removal of the mature hedges.

### Summary:

I strongly object to the significant and unacceptable increase in scale between the existing and proposed house and outbuildings. The hike in height from 5.5m to 9.4m is unacceptable. The combination of effects from the increase in scale and removal of significant natural landscaping screening will cause on the amenity of Dalton House and the

wider special landscape should not be supported. I fail to see how the proposal can be reported to have 'no materially greater impact on the landscape'.

I understand the planning officer, within his report has made a to Members to approve this application with conditions. I am gravely concerned there is no volumetric information before you on which to base this decision and the approval would set an unacceptable precedent on how the Vale of Glamorgan Council will treat such redevelopments in the future.

I urge Members to defer the decision on this application as information of existing and proposed comparisons for **all elevations** is absent, **as is** existing and proposed ground levels. Without this critical information the detrimental effects of the scheme on the landscape and wider character of the area, as well as neighbouring properties, cannot be adequately and robustly assessed.
