Executive Summary:

- The report provides an update on the progress of the Capital programme for the period 1st April 2020 to 31st January 2021. Details by scheme are shown in Appendix 1.
- The report sets out any requested changes to the 2020/21 and future years Capital Programme.

Recommendations

It is recommended :-

- St David's Highway Works s106 Increase the Capital Programme by £127k; £16k in 2021/22 and £111k in 2021/22, to be funded from s106 monies.
- Everyone Garden Education Centre Include this new scheme into the 2020/21 Capital Programme with a budget of £20,000 to be funded by a grant from Natural Resources Wales.
- The Knap Gardens Water and Biodiversity Project Bring forward £8k from 2021/22 to the 2020/21 Capital Programme.
- TRI Thematic Grants Programme Allocate a budget of £152,923 from the Targeted Regeneration Investment to the Thematic Grants Programme scheme in the 2020/21 Capital Programme plus increase the budget by £10,400 to be funded from the Capital Economic Regeneration Reserve and vire a budget of £27,830 from the Barry Regeneration Project Development Fund. - Windmill Lane Play Area Increase the Capital Programme by £68k; £5k in 2020/21 and £63k in 2021/22, to be funded from s106 monies.

- Wick Primary Security Lobby Increase this scheme budget by £2,886 in the 2020/21 Capital Programme, to be funded by a virement of £2,595 from the High Street Primary Playground Resurfacing Asset Renewal Scheme and £291 virement from the St Brides Major Security Fencing Scheme.
- Penarth Esplanade Highway Infrastructure Improvements Include this new scheme with a budget of £150k into the 2020/21 Capital Programme to be funded from capital receipts.
- Ogmore by Sea Car Park Refurbishment Increase this scheme budget by £9k in the 2020/21 Capital Programme to be funded from the Neighbourhood Services and Transport reserve.
- Vehicle Replacement Programme Increase this scheme budget in the 2020/21 Capital Programme by £15k to be funded from the Vehicle Fund.
- Penarth Leisure Centre High Level Glazing Panels Include this new scheme on to the Capital Programme with a budget of £60k, to be profiled £15k in 2020/21 and £45k in 2021/22. The £15k will be funded by a revenue contribution from the Leisure Centre Maintenance budget and the £45k will be funded from the Miscellaneous Building Fund reserve.
- Sports Wales Grant Include a new scheme with a budget of £30k on the 2020/21 Capital Programme called Romilly Tennis Courts and to also increase the Sports Wales Grants scheme by £38.9k in the 2020/21 Capital, both to be funded by a grant from Sports Wales.
- All Wales Play Opportunities Grant Include a new scheme on the 2020/21 Capital Programme with a budget of £132,973, to be funded by a grant from Welsh Government.
- Road Safety 20mph Pilot St Brides Major Include this scheme with a budget of £76,473 in the 2020/21 Capital Programme to be funded by a grant from Welsh Government.
- ICF Penarth Older Persons Village Vire £573K from the HRA acquisition budget and to approve its inclusion in the Council's capital programme to enable feasibility work to continue and incur costs for the Penarth Housing with Care Complex, pending receipt of the ICF grant award.
- **5.** That Cabinet approves the following changes to the 2020/21 and future years Capital Programme:-
- Childcare Offer Capital Grant Carry forward £550k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.

- St Richard Gwyn High School External Canopies Include this scheme with a budget of £23,725 in the 2020/21 Capital Programme, 50% will be funded via the COVID Local Authority Hardship grant and 50% will be funded by a revenue contribution from the Saint Richard Gwyn delegated school budget.
- St Illtyd Primary Fire Precaution Works Carry forward £17k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- Disability Access Carry forward a budget of £4k and vire it to the DDA scheme in the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- Cashless Catering Solution Increase this budget by £4k in the 2020/21 Capital Programme to be funded by a contribution from the Catering Equipment reserve.
- Asbestos Removal Carry forward £19k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- Radon Monitoring Carry forward £35k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- Security Vire £2k to the Wick Primary Security Lobby scheme for security signage in the 2020/21 Capital Programme and carry forward £41k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- Radon Carry forward £10k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- Resurfacing at Port Road West from Cwm Ciddy to Dragon's Tail Roundabout Vire £22k to the Visible Services Highway Improvement scheme in the 2020/21 Capital Programme.
- Penarth Leisure Centre, Lift Renewal Carry forward £45k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- Llantwit Major Leisure Centre, Lift Renewal Carry forward £45k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- Highway Structures Carry forward £65k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- Dinas Powys Library Bridge Carry forward £13k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme and vire it to the Murchfield Access Bridge scheme.
- Eastern Shelter Resurface Roof Carry forward £80k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- Street Lighting Energy Reduction Strategy Reduce this budget in the capital programme to £1,650k and to carry forward £700k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- Court Road Depot Carry forward £349k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- Vale Enterprise Centre New Windows Carry forward £69k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- Tackling Poverty Carry forward £133k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.

- Building Strong Communities Fund Request to increase this budget in the 2020/21 Capital Programme by £56k to be funded from the Building Strong Communities revenue budget.
- Upgrade of backup and recovery infrastructure Carry forward £165k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- Replace Network Switches Carry forward the £12k budget into the 2021/22 Capital Programme and to also vire the budget to the Upgrade of backup and recovery infrastructure Scheme.
- Hwb Programme Increase budget by £1,463,951 in the 2020/21 Capital Programme to be funded from £1,419,663 Welsh Government grant and £44,288 from school revenue budgets.

1. Background

1.1 Council on 26th February 2020 (minute no 710) approved the Capital Programme for 2020/21 onwards.

2. Key Issues for Consideration

- **2.1** Appendix 1 details financial progress on the Capital Programme as at 31st January 2021.
- **2.2** For all schemes where it is evident that the full year's budget will not be spent during the year, the relevant officers are required to provide an explanation for the shortfall, and this shall be taken to the earliest available Cabinet.

Learning and Skills

2.3 Education Asset Renewal Contingency - The 2020/21 Capital Programme had an unallocated budget of £163k for the Education Asset Renewal Contingency budget. Due to the £334k shortfall in s106 funding within the Band B Programme, delegated authority has been used to carry forward £100k of this budget and vire it to the Band B Programme. The remaining £234k gap has been identified; £30k from funds released due to additional WG funding, £200k from Education Asset Renewal (£100k Asset Renewal in 2022/23 and £50k contingency)

in 2021/22 and 2022/23) and £4k revenue contribution to capital. This was requested within the Final Capital Proposals report 2021/22 to 2025/26.

- 2.4 St David's Highway Works s106 Delegated authority has been used to increase the Capital Programme by £127k (£16k in 2021/22 and £111k in 2021/22) for feasibility, design and implementation of sustainable transport improvements between St. David's CiW Primary School and the play area/community centre. This scheme is funded from s106 monies.
- 2.5 Penarth Library LED Lighting Penarth Library requires new lighting to improve its energy performance, reduce lighting costs and improve its user experience. It is currently undergoing building renovation and improvement works with appointed contractors already on site. It is intended that this work will be funded in whole from the council's access to its Salix SEELS fund and Energy Commission Reinvestment Fund (ECRF) for investment of energy-saving technologies. Emergency powers have been used to include this new scheme in the 2020/21 Capital Programme with a budget of £16,036 to be funded £13,500 from a Salix SEELS loan and £2,536 from the Energy Management Fund.
- 2.6 Home Learning Laptops In order to take advantage of a very favourable offer on laptops, and to get devices out to schools as soon as possible to aid home learning, an urgent order totalling £50,051 has been placed. This is classed as capital expenditure, and emergency powers have been used to include this new scheme on to the 2020/21 Capital Programme with a budget of £50,051 to be funded from the School Rationalisation reserve.
- 2.7 Band B Programme The Council have received an award of funding from Welsh Government of £1,050k to support decarbonisation within the 21st Century Schools Band B Programme. The breakdown of the £1,050k grant is:-
 - St David's CIW Primary School £50k
 - Primary Provision in the Western Vale £500k
 - St Nicholas CIW Primary School £500k

Emergency powers have been used to increase the 2021/22 Capital Programme by £1,050k and this grant has released £1,050k of the Council's own resources and it was approved via the emergency powers that the released monies would be allocated as below.

- Cowbridge Primary Provision £400k
- St David's CIW Primary School £150k
- Primary Provision in the Western Vale £170k

- Unallocated £330k (This has now been allocated as part of the Final Capital Proposals report)

The Band B Programme has since been updated in the Final Capital Proposals report that was taken to Cabinet on the 8th February 2021.

- 2.8 Cashless Catering Solution Following agreement by the board of The Big Fresh Catering Company (BFCC), the use of emergency powers was requested to replacement the existing cashless catering contract in secondary schools which was due to expire in March 2021. Costs include capital of £44,285 for the associated hardware & software plus £10,000 maintenance for the next 3 years. Emergency powers have been used to include this new scheme with a budget of £44,285 into the 2020/21 Capital Programme, to be funded by the Catering Equipment reserve. This hardware/software asset will be added to the list of items that BFCC lease from the Council. However, a school was overlooked in the original quote for the scheme and the total required budget is now £48k. It is therefore requested to increase this budget by £4k in the 2020/21 Capital Programme to also be funded by a contribution from the Catering Equipment reserve.
- 2.9 Digital Exclusion Fund The Council has been awarded additional funding of £6,650 in relation to the Digital Exclusion Fund grant. Capital funding has been earmarked to help local authorities delivering adult learning in the community to support their learners to engage with digital and distance learning and address some of the common barriers to engagement with learning for learners who are digitally-excluded and/or have additional accessibility requirements. Funding can be used for the purchase of essential equipment, and/or purchase of software in order to upgrade existing equipment. £14,570 has already previously been awarded and is already included in the Capital Programme. The additional funding will give a total budget of £21,220 for 2020/21. Emergency powers have been used to increase this scheme by £6,650 in the 2020/21 Capital Programme.
- 2.10 Wick Primary Security Lobby The original budget for this scheme was £50k, during the course of the works it was necessary to carry out a number of additional items of work relating to general building repairs and upgrading the electrical consumer unit together with ICT works. This increased the cost of the works and when taking into account the addition of professional fees and all known associated costs, the overall total cost of the project increased to £52,886. Emergency powers has been used to increase this scheme budget by £2,886 in the 2020/21 Capital Programme, to be funded by a virement of £2,595 from the High Street Primary Playground Resurfacing Asset Renewal Scheme and £291 virement from the St Brides Major Security Fencing Scheme. Both schemes are complete and under budget.
- 2.11 Childcare Offer Capital Grant The Gladstone childcare unit was handed over just before Christmas however there are some additional drainage work that are now required, the extent of which is currently being investigated. This is likely to be carried out in Spring / Summer of this year. Spend this year is anticipated to be £395k. Cabinet approved the appointment of the contractor on 24 February 2020 to carry out the welsh medium scheme, the planning application has been submitted, the Council has put in a request for additional funding for decarbonisation and COVID costs to WG. The scheme is anticipated to complete in September 2021. Spend this year is anticipated to be £18k. It is requested to

carry forward £550k (£248k for Gladstone and £302k for welsh medium scheme) into the 2021/22 Capital Programme. The appropriate variation requests have been submitted to Welsh Government.

- 2.12 Barry Island Primary Drainage The flood alleviation works were completed in the Summer holidays with further remedial works to existing drainage in October. A replacement run off drain involving excavation works is still to be carried out, this will take place next financial year. It is therefore requested to carry forward £30k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- **2.13** Romilly Primary WC Refurbishment This scheme is £3k over budget however the Llandough Primary WC Refurbishment is £3k under budget. It is therefore requested to vire £3k from the Llandough Primary WC Refurbishments scheme to this scheme within the 2020/21 Capital Programme.
- 2.14 Victoria Primary WC Renewal (Staff) This scheme is £4k over budget however the Victoria Primary WC Renewal is under budget. It is therefore requested to vire £4k from the Victoria Primary WC Renewal scheme to this scheme within the 2020/21 Capital Programme.
- 2.15 St Richard Gwyn High School External Canopies External canopies have been installed as St Richard Gwyn High School, the total cost of the canopies is £23,725. It is requested to include this scheme with a budget of £23,725 in the 2020/21 Capital Programme, 50% will be funded via the COVID Local Authority Hardship grant and 50% will be funded by a revenue contribution from the St Richard Gwyn delegated school budget.
- **2.16** St Illtyd Primary Fire Precaution Works The fire alarm works were completed in 2018/19. A scope of works needs to be agreed with the fire officer for the remainder of the budget. These works will not be programmed until 2021/22. It is requested to carry forward £17k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- **2.17** Disability Access This £4k budget is unallocated, it is requested to carry forward this budget and vire it to the DDA scheme in the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- **2.18** Asbestos Removal The projected spend for this scheme in the 2020/21 Capital Programme is £18k. It is therefore requested to carry forward £19k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme for further asbestos removal works to be carried out as required next financial year.
- **2.19** Radon Monitoring The projected spend for this scheme in the 2020/21 Capital Programme is £13k. It is therefore requested to carry forward £35k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme for further radon monitoring works to be carried out as required next financial year.
- **2.20** Security The total spend for this scheme in 2020/21 is £21k, no further security works are anticipated until 2021/22, it is therefore requested to vire £2k to the

Wick Primary Security Lobby scheme for security signage in the 2020/21 Capital Programme. It is also requested to carry forward £41k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.

Social Services

2.21 Radon - This scheme will not commence until next financial year. It is therefore requested to carry forward £10k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.

Environment & Housing

- 2.22 Penarth Esplanade Highway Infrastructure Improvements Due to the urgent need to implement the Traffic Road Order required for the parking scheme prior to the Spring when visitor number generally increase and to avoid abortive works associated with necessary road markings, it has been proposed to bring the resurfacing element of the works forward. It has been approved via emergency powers to include this new scheme with a budget of £150k into the 2020/21 Capital Programme to be funded from capital receipts. £250k has been included as a proposal for 2021/22 in the Final Capital Proposals report 2021/22 to 2025/26 and is subject to approval as part of the five-year Capital Programme.
- 2.23 Ogmore by Sea Car Park Refurbishment The cost of this scheme has increased by £9k as additional costs relating to the ANPR system integration and compatibility with the IPS pay and display machines have now been included. To allow this scheme to progress it has been approved by emergency powers to increase this scheme budget by £9k in the 2020/21 Capital Programme to be funded from the Neighbourhood Services and Transport reserve.
- 2.24 Vehicle Replacement Programme Two vehicles have been purchased totalling £68k that are required to be funded from the respective service areas. This has resulted in £68k funding being swapped from the Vehicle Fund reserve to a revenue contribution to capital from the service areas. £12k of the vehicle budget remains for 2020/21 however a minibus was required to be purchased for Building Cleaning. The cost of the minibus is £26k and emergency powers have been used to increase the Vehicle Replacement Programme budget in the 2020/21 Capital Programme by £15k to be funded from the Vehicle Fund reserve.
- 2.25 Penarth Leisure Centre High Level Glazing Panels A capital bid was submitted for Penarth Leisure Centre High Level Glazing Panels. Isolated emergency repairs have previously been carried out, but further remedial works to all the remaining glazing at this level is urgently required. Unless remedial works are carried out there is a health and safety risk. Emergency powers have therefore been used to include this new scheme into the Capital Programme with a budget of £60k, to be profiled £15k in 2020/21 and £45k in 2021/22. The £15k will be funded by a revenue contribution from the Leisure Centre Maintenance budget and the £45k will be funded from the Miscellaneous Building Fund reserve.

- 2.26 Sports Wales Grant The Council had received a revised offer letter for 2020/21 in relation to the Sports Wales Grant. The Funding relates to the period 1 April 2020 to 31 March 2021. The offer includes an additional £106k sport and leisure recovery package. This investment has been provided by Welsh Government as an additional fund to support partners 'thrive' from the COVID-19 pandemic. The £106k is split between revenue (£37.1k) and capital (£68.9k). Emergency powers have been used to include a new scheme with a budget of £30k in the 2020/21 Capital Programme called Romilly Tennis Courts and to also increase the Sports Wales Grants scheme by £38.9k in the 2020/21 Capital Programme.
- 2.27 All Wales Play Opportunities Grant The Council had received an award of funding of £154,973 in relation to the All Wales Play Opportunities Grant from Welsh Government. The Funding relates to the period 1 April 2020 to 31 March 2021. The capital allocation of this grant is for £132,973. The purpose of the funding is to enable the Council to meet some of the actions within their 2020/21 Play Sufficiency Assessment (PSA) Action Plan. Emergency powers have been used to include a new scheme in the 2020/21 Capital Programme with a budget of £132,973, to be funded by a grant from Welsh Government.
- 2.28 Road Safety 20mph Pilot St Brides Major The Council has received an award of funding in relation to Road Safety Capital grant. The total amount allocated to Road Safety Capital for the financial year 2020/2021 is £76,473. This money has been awarded to carry out the St Brides Major 20mph pilot scheme. The monies have to be spent by the 31st March 2021. The scheme had to commence as soon as possible to ensure that the grant can be spent by the deadline. Emergency powers have been used to include this scheme with a budget of £76,473 in the 2020/21 Capital Programme to be funded by a grant from Welsh Government.
- 2.29 ICF - Penarth Older Persons Village - The Council faces the challenge of increasing demands on its housing and social care services due to an ageing population. In order to respond to this growing demand, Housing Services in partnership with colleagues in Social Services, Health and a Registered Social Landlord is exploring the feasibility of developing a creatively designed older persons residential development concept called Penarth Older Persons Housing with Care Complex on 3.6 acres of housing owned land off Myrtle Close in Penarth. Preliminary feasibility and site investigation work was carried out in 2018/19 funded by a capital grant of £40,773 and in 2019/20 £120,000 from the Integrated Care Fund (ICF) from Welsh Government, administered by Cardiff and Vale Local Health Board. The Council has recently received approval for a further capital ICF award of £573,000 for 2020/21 to continue this work which must be spent by 31st March 2021. While Welsh Government confirmed that the funding was approved by its ICF Scrutiny Panel at the beginning of December and Ministerial approval was expected imminently to allow a confirmation letter to be sent to the Council before Christmas, to date this has still not been received. In order to commence this work as soon as possible, permission is therefore being sought to include the £573,000 into the capital programme, pending receipt of the formal grant approval letter from Welsh Government. Emergency powers has been used to

approve the virement of £573,000 from the HRA acquisition budget and to approve its inclusion in the Council's capital programme to enable feasibility work to continue and incur costs for the Penarth Housing with Care Complex, pending receipt of the ICF grant award letter.

- 2.30 Everyone Garden Education Centre Delegated authority has been used to include this new scheme into the 2020/21 Capital programme with a budget of £20,000 to be funded by a grant from Natural Resources Wales. The scheme is the creation of an education centre as part of the 'Everyone's Garden' project on land owned by the Council's housing department in Barry. An education centre is being built with involvement from the local community and is integrated into the existing community garden and play area.
- **2.31** Resurfacing at Port Road West from Cwm Ciddy to Dragon's Tail Roundabout -This scheme is complete, it is therefore requested to vire £22k to the Visible Services Highway Improvement scheme in the 2020/21 Capital Programme.
- 2.32 Penarth Leisure Centre, Lift Renewal This scheme is delayed due to equipment and part delays of 8 weeks due to Brexit and operational programming issues due to COVID-19. This scheme will commence early in the new financial year, it is therefore requested to carry forward £45k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- **2.33** Llantwit Major Leisure Centre, Lift Renewal This scheme is delayed due to equipment and part delays of 8 weeks due to Brexit and operational programming issues due to COVID-19. This scheme will commence early in the new financial year, it is therefore requested to carry forward £45k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- 2.34 Highway Structures The anticipated spend for this scheme in 2020/21 is £25k for the Darren Hill Retaining Wall Fence (Cowbridge bypass fencing) works. £65k of the budget remains unallocated and further works will be programmed in 2021/22. It is therefore requested to carry forward £65k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- 2.35 Dinas Powys Library Bridge This total cost of this scheme has come in under budget, however the Murchfield Access Bridge scheme total cost is £13k over budget. It is therefore requested to carry forward £13k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme and vire it to the Murchfield Access Bridge scheme so that the works can progress in 2021/22.
- **2.36** Eastern Shelter Resurface Roof Repairs to the footpath at Barry Island leading to the Eastern Shelter have been completed. The survey and joint replacement work's commenced in quarter four. Further works are being reviewed. It is therefore requested to carry forward £80k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.

2.37 Street Lighting Energy Reduction Strategy - Following return of tenders and the competitive nature of the prices received as well as the reducing costs of LED lantern technology, the total cost is anticipated to be £1,650k. Orders have been placed for the works and lanterns are anticipated to be delivered before the end of the financial year. Installation works are due to commence on 8th March however will not be complete by the end of the financial year. It is therefore requested to reduce this budget in the capital programme to £1,650k and to carry forward £700k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme. The original 2020/21 budget of £2,289k was funded from £373k capital receipts and £1,916k Salix loan. Discussions are being carried out with Salix to clarify if funding the project solely from Salix Loan with no contribution from the Council's internal capital is possible. This will hopefully be confirmed in the next 2-3 weeks.

Managing Director and Resources

- 2.38 The Knap Gardens Water and Biodiversity Project This scheme is currently programmed over two financial years, with £5k in 2020/21 and £105k 2021/22. Progress is currently being made and it is anticipated more spend will be incurred in 2020/21 than originally anticipated. Delegated authority has been used to bring forward £8k to 2020/21, to make the budget £13k overall in the 2020/21 Capital Programme.
- 2.39 TRI Thematic Grants Programme Delegated authority has been used to allocate a budget of £152,923 (80% of the budget cost) from the Targeted Regeneration Investment to the Thematic Grants Programme scheme in the 2020/21 Capital Programme for the schemes listed in the table below. As part of this delegated authority it was also requested that the 2020/21 Capital Programme was increased by £38,230 (20%), £10,400 to be funded from the Capital Economic Regeneration Reserve and £27,830 to be vired from the Barry Regeneration Project Development Fund.

- 2.40 Windmill Lane Play Area Delegated authority has been used to increase the Capital Programme by £68k; £5k in 2020/21 and £63k in 2021/22, using s106 public open space monies received from the development as Plasnewydd Farm, Llantwit Major, to improve the play area at Windmill Lane.
- **2.41** Court Road Depot Survey, Feasibility and Infrastructure Budget This budget is to assist with the relocating of Court Road Depot and it is requested to carry forward this £349k budget into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- 2.42 Vale Enterprise Centre New Windows Due to increasing costs it was decided to tender for the works via Sell to Wales. This is currently live with an end date of 3rd March. Award is anticipated on 8th March and therefore work will not start on site until 2021/22 financial year. It is requested to carry forward £69k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- **2.43** Tackling Poverty This project has not commenced due to COVID-19 and staff resources being diverted to delivering town center recovery measures. It is requested to carry forward £133k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- 2.44 Building Strong Communities Fund It is requested to increase this budget in the 2020/21 Capital Programme by £56k to be funded from the Building Strong Communities revenue budget. This budget will fund the schemes listed below:-

- Vale Cricket Club toilet refurbishment £14k
- Llandow Village Hall roof renewal £20k
- 1st Penmark Scouts toilet and kitchen refurbishment £22k
- 2.45 Upgrade of Backup and Recovery Infrastructure This scheme has been unable to commence this financial year due to the pressure on the ICT team because of the current pandemic. It is therefore requested to carry forward £165k into the 2021/22 Capital Programme.
- **2.46** Replace Network Switches This scheme is complete and it is requested to carry forward the £12k budget into the 2021/22 Capital Programme and to vire the budget to the Upgrade of Backup and Recovery Infrastructure scheme.
- 2.47 Hwb Programme The Council has been awarded a grant in relation to the Hwb In-School Infrastructure programme. The allocation for 2020/21 is £1,419,663, with £1,201,110 of the total being retained by the Welsh Government for expenditure through the all Wales ICT Catalogue via Caerphilly Council. Following the recent work to support Digitally Excluded Learners the Neverware and MiFi connectivity arrangements have now been finalised and a further £76,587 of the total will be retained by the Welsh Government to support the upfront and ongoing monthly connectivity costs. The balance of £141,966 has therefore been confirmed as the grant allocation which will be paid directly to the Council. A contribution of £44,288 will also be made by schools in order to cover expenditure that will maximise functionality. It is requested that this budget is increased by £1,463,951 in the 2020/21 Capital Programme to be funded from £1,419,663 Welsh Government grant and £44,288 from school revenue budgets.

3. How do proposals evidence the Five Ways of Working and contribute to our Well-being Objectives?

- **3.1** The Capital Programme focuses capital investment to deliver the outcomes identified as part of the Corporate Plan. Some examples are :-
- To work with and for our communities Consultations are carried out with the community on capital projects e.g. Band B and park schemes. Building Stronger Communities capital grants are being issued to support projects being carried out by members of the community.
- To support learning, employment and sustainable economic growth Further investment in schools through the School Investment Programme with Band A complete and development under Band B which commenced in 2019/20. Contributing as a partner in the Cardiff Capital Region City Deal will bring economic prosperity to the area. There will be continued investment in environment and regeneration programmes to support economic growth.

- **To support people at home and in their community** Investment in housing through the Housing Improvement Programme will maintain the Welsh Housing Quality Standard and there is a new build programme. Disabled Facility Grants are also issued to residents. Investment in leisure centres and playgrounds will encourage more use and activity. The core active travel fund allocation grant from Welsh Government is used to implement active travel schemes.
- To respect, enhance and enjoy our environment In response to the climate emergency, the Council launched a project to explore how construction practices could be adapted to support decarbonisation as part the 21st Century Schools Programme. St David's CIW Primary School was designed to be low (in-use) carbon through improved building fabric, maximising renewables and its only energy source is electric. This model was further developed to deliver net-zero (in-use) carbon school buildings for Llancarfan Primary School and St Nicholas CIW Primary School. The Llancarfan Primary School scheme is due to be completed in 2021 which will make it the first net-zero carbon primary school building in Wales. Investing in the introduction of LED street lighting will bring environmental benefits. Funding has been made available for the installation of vehicle charging infrastructure and for the purchase of electric pool cars. The school decarbonisation programme consists of a variety of energy reduction measures and renewable energy installations have been identified across a number of assets within the school portfolio. Recycling is now to be sorted into separate containers, the change is aimed at improving the quality of the materials that are collected for recycling which is better for the environment and will help the Council to recycle more.
- **3.2** The setting and the monitoring of the Capital programme follows the Five Ways of Working.
- **3.3** Looking to the long term The development of the capital programme is a means of planning for the future and takes a strategic approach to ensure services are sustainable and that investments are affordable over the longer term and that future need and demand for services is understood.
- **3.4** Taking an integrated approach In setting the capital programme, working with partners is encouraged, as it allows the utilisation of funding from various sources, such as Welsh Government and S106 contributions, to deliver schemes.
- **3.5** Involving the population in decisions As part of the annual budget setting process there is engagement with residents, customers and partners. Prior to the implementation of certain capital schemes, consultation may also take place with the public which may in some cases be statutory.
- **3.6** Working in a collaborative way It is recognised that more can be achieved and better services can be provided by collaboration and it encourages this as a way of working in the future which includes providing funding to work with local communities.

3.7 Understanding the root cause of issues and preventing them – The process for setting and monitoring the capital programme is proactive and allows an understanding of the financial and operational issues to be considered together so that issues can be tackled at the source.
