

ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS

Supply of Alcohol

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence, or his personal licence is suspended.

2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence

Irresponsible Drinks Promotions

- 1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-
- (a)games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
- (i)drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii)drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b)provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c)provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d)selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e)dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

2- Free drinking water

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

3- Age verification Policy

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
- (a)a holographic mark, or

(b)an ultraviolet feature.

4- Smaller Measures

The responsible person must ensure that-

(a)where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed

container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

(i)beer or cider: 1/2 pint;

(ii)gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii)still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b)these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c)where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Pricing

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-

(a)"duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula-

 $P = D + (D \times V)$

Where-

(i) P is the permitted price,

- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- **4.** (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Door Supervision

Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, the licence must include a condition that each such individual must

(a)be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or

(b)be entitled to carry out that activity.

But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed-

(a)in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c. 12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or

(b)in respect of premises in relation to-

(i)any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or

(ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).

(3) For the purposes of this section-

(a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act (see section 3(2) of that Act), and

(b)paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

- Two qualified SIA security staff to be employed at the premises from 22.00 until close of business on Fridays, Saturdays and any Seasonal Variations when the hours of licensable activity extend beyond midnight.
- Patrons will be prevented from taking glass vessels outside the premises.
- The bar will operate a 'Challenge 25' scheme.
- No under 18's are permitted to use the premises. Persons who appear to be under 21 will have to provide evidence that they are over 18.

ANNEX 3 - CONDITIONS ATTACHED AFTER A HEARING BY THE LICENSING AUTHORITY

Capacity and Safe Condition of Premises

- 1. No overcrowding in any part of the premises which would interfere with the safety or comfort of the public shall be permitted.
- 2. Hangings, curtains and temporary decorations are maintained in a flame-retardant conditions.

Heating and Ventilation

3. The premises shall be adequately ventilated in all areas to which the staff and public have access so as to enable doors and windows including after 2330hrs to remain closed thereby enabling the premises to reduce the likelihood of a public nuisance to nearby residents caused by the breakout of noise.

Noise and Vibration

- 4. Noise and vibration shall not be permitted to emanate from or transmit through the premises so as to cause a public nuisance to the occupiers or nearby and/or adjoining properties..
- 5. All reasonably practicable steps shall be taken to prevent a noise nuisance at any neighbouring properties as public and staff leave and use the premises.
- 6. Clearly legible notices shall be displayed at all exits from the premises requesting public and staff to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
- 7. Doors and windows shall be kept closed as far as reasonably practicable to reduce the noise impact from the licensed premises at neighbouring properties. Windows and doors shall be closed whilst regulated entertainment is being carried on and after 2330hrs.
- 8. It must be demonstrated that appropriate measures that will be taken to limit noise from deliveries, collections and servicing and that these will prevent avoidable noise disturbance to noise sensitive properties. Such measures should include:
- 9. Ensuring that deliveries, collections and operational servicing are carried out in reasonable hours such as after 0800hrs a.m. and not after 1900hrs p.m. except where access at other times is unavoidable and specific procedures are in place to limit disturbance.

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- 11. Only the use of polycarbonate/plastic drinking vessels to be permitted in the external drinking area except for wine bottles and vessels used for the consumption of tea and coffee.
- 12. The outside area shall only be used between the hours of 09:00 and 19:00.
- 13. All bottles and drinking vessels shall be removed from exterior drinking areas periodically and the outside area cleared on closure at 19:00.
