### AGENDA ITEM 3. LICENSING ACT 2003 - VARIATION OF A PREMISES LICENCE – FOXY'S DELI, 7 ROYAL BUILDINGS, VICTORIA ROAD, PENARTH, CF64 3ED –

RESOLVED – T H A T the application, with amended hours of 10:00 sale start on a Sunday, be granted.

#### Reason for decision

In reaching its decision, the Sub-Committee had considered the application along with all those who had made both written and oral submissions. The Sub-Committee had taken into account the Licensing Act 2003 as amended, in particular the licensing objectives and the Home Office Guidance along with the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy. There was a presumption in law that licenses should be granted and should matters relating to the Licensing Objectives arise the licence may be reviewed, based on evidence of the non-compliance with the objectives.

The Sub-Committee were satisfied that the premises were currently licensed with no issues having been raised in relation to its current operation by both the Police and/ or the Environmental Health Department. The Sub-Committee were of the view that if issues were to arise by extending the hours of the current operation that the matter could be dealt with by way of a review of the licence based on noise nuisance and or

crime and disorder relating to the premises and not neighbouring businesses that operated in the vicinity.
