<p>Executive Summary:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To consider an application submitted by Santosh Kumar Dacheapalli to vary a Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of The Corner Shop, 31-33 Crawshay Drive, Llantwit Major CF61 2LH. 	

Recommendations

1. The Sub-Committee is required to determine the application having regard to the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, the Guidance issued by the Home Office under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, the application and any representations submitted.

If minded to grant the application, the Sub-Committee is requested to confirm whether any additional conditions are to be imposed or only those which are consistent with and set out in the operating schedule.

Reasons for Recommendations

1. To advise the Members of the options available to them under the Licensing Act 2003 in determining the matter.

1. Background

- 1.1 The premises currently benefits from a premises licence; PRM AS0353 which authorises the following licensable activities during the hours stated:

The Sale of Alcohol for Consumption off the Premises:

Monday to Sunday 07:00 hours to 21:00 hours

- 1.2 A copy of the current premises licence is attached at Appendix A.

2. Key Issues for Consideration

- 2.1 On 11 June 2024 the Licensing Authority received an application to vary the premises licence. The variation application is attached at Appendix B.

- 2.2 The variation application proposed to extend the Sale of Alcohol for consumption off the premises to:

Monday to Sunday 07:00 hours to 23:00 hours

- 2.3 The application includes an Operating Schedule which sets out the steps the applicant proposes to take to promote the licensing objectives. These steps are detailed in Section M of the application form and can be found in Appendix B.

- 2.4 Three representations have been received from local Councillors who allege the proposals undermine the licensing objectives. A copy of the representations are detailed in Appendix C.

- 2.5** A representation was also submitted by South Wales Police during the consultation period. This representation was subsequently withdrawn, and instead licensing conditions were agreed with the applicant; these are to be imposed on the licence if the application is granted. The agreed conditions are detailed in Appendix D.
- 2.6** As relevant representations have been received the Sub-Committee must determine the application in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003.

- 5.3** The Licensing Act 2003 (Section 4) states that it is the duty of all Licensing Authorities to carry out their functions under the Act with a view to promoting the licensing objectives. The licensing objectives are:

- a) The prevention of crime and disorder
- b) Public Safety
- c) The prevention of public safety
- d) Protection of children from harm

Each objective is of equal importance and should be of paramount consideration at all times.

- 5.4** Section 4(3) Licensing Act 2003 states that the Licensing Authority should have regard to the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, the Statutory guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Licensing Act itself, in this case in particular to:
- a) Paragraphs 1, 2, 3, 7, 8, 9, 11 and 12. There is no specific policy relating to the area for this type of application.
 - b) Chapters 2, 8, 9, 10 and 16 of the Statutory guidance, as revised July 2023.
 - c) Sections 4, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 34, 35, 36, 182 and 183 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 5.5** In each case the Sub-Committee may make the following determination:
- a) Grant the application.
 - b) Modify the conditions of the licence, by altering, omitting or adding to them, where relevant.
 - c) Reject the whole or part of the application.
- (Section 35, Licensing Act 2003)*
- 5.6** In accordance with the requirements of the Act, copies of the application were forwarded to the Responsible Authorities.
- 5.7** The application has been advertised in accordance with the regulations; at the premises, in a local newspaper and on the Council's website.

ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS**Supply of Alcohol**

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence, or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence

Age verification Policy

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Minimum Pricing

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979.

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula-

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where-

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE**Prevention of Crime and Disorder**


1. CCTV is to operate at all times when the premises are open to the public. The equipment should be to an agreed standard covering all areas to which the public has access. Coverage should include all entrances and exits. Images should be retained for 31 days and produced on request of the police as soon as practicable.
2. The premises will not engage in any irresponsible drink promotions that encourage binge drinking.

Thank you Kirsty, for you prompt response.

May I register my formal objection to the licencing hours extension for the Crawshay Court Corner shop, due to the increase likelihood of antisocial behaviour in a residential area, which is the site of older peoples' accomodate on in the form of senior citizen's bungalows and supported living flats.

I do not see the benefit of two hours longer in which people can buy alcohol, at the detriment of local residents.

Agreed Police Conditions

1. All customer focused staff will receive relevant training in relation to alcohol sales and the promotion of the licensing objectives. This training will be refreshed annually with a record held on the premise. The training record shall be retained for a period of 12 months and will be made available for inspection upon request by a South Wales Police officer or other authorised person.
2. An incident record shall be kept at the premises for a rolling 12-month period. Any incident of crime or disorder witnessed by staff, or any incident reported by customers will be noted in the log. The following shall be recorded in relation to each incident:
 - a. date and time of the incident;
 - b. name of person making the report;
 - c. names of the parties involved (if known) or description of the parties;
 - d. nature of the incident;
 - e. any action taken thereafter;
 - f. refusals of sale.
3. Clear and legible notices will be prominently displayed to remind customers to leave quietly and have regard to our neighbours.
4. A "Challenge 25" Policy shall be implemented in full and appropriate identification sought from any person who appears to be under the age of 25. The only acceptable photographic driving licences, passports, HM Forces cards, or a form of identification with the "Pass Logo".
5. No display of alcohol shall be located within a two metre radius of the main front entrance/exit doors of the store, unless stored behind a staffed payment counter.
6. There shall be no sale of single/split cans of any beers, lagers or cider.
