| Purpose of Report: | To advise Scrutiny Committee of the progress relating to revenue and capital expenditure for the period 1st April to 31st August 2019 |

Executive Summary:

- The revenue position for 2019/20 is challenging with a savings target for the year being set at £1.044m. It is anticipated that savings will not be fully achieved in year.
- The capital budget has been set at £29.13m this financial year.

Recommendations

1. That Scrutiny Committee consider the position with regard to the 2019/20 revenue and capital budgets.

Reasons for Recommendations

2. That Members are aware of the projected revenue outturn for 2019/20.

1. Background

1.1 On 8th March 2019, Council approved the Revenue Budget for 2019/20, minute no 835 and Council on 27th February 2019 approved the Capital Programme for 2019/20 onwards, minute number 780.

2. Key Issues for Consideration

Revenue

2.1 The service is anticipating an adverse variance by year end and will not achieve its savings target in full this year.

- 2.2 Neighbourhood Services & Transport This service is currently projecting to have an adverse variance of £1.520m against the 2019/20 budget. The savings target for 2019/20 is £932k. Plans for saving this amount are underway and being continually monitored however several of the proposed savings have a long lead in time therefore it is currently projected that only around half of the savings will be found in 2019/20. The anticipated shortfall of £470k will be funded via the Neighbourhood Services Reserve.
- 2.3 Within the Waste Collection Service it is anticipated that there will be an adverse variance of around £650k. There is still pressure on employee and transport budgets due to downtime involved in travelling to Cardiff to dispose of waste. Cowbridge is currently being used as a temporary transfer station for elements of recycling material with the aim of reducing this downtime however additional resource is still being utilised. The planned future service changes to the waste collection service are likely to require further resource in the initial period of service change. There is also pressure on the budget due to the high price currently being paid to treat our co-mingled recycling. The price has increased steadily over the last couple of years since China banned elements of recycling such as plastic into the country. This has been compounded by a high % of dry recycling collected since May 2019 being rejected by the new contractor. The rejected material has had to be sent for more expensive treatment or landfill which has cost an additional £150k from May to August 2019. Changes have been made to the collection process with the aim of ensuring the correct containers are placed on the kerbside for dry recycling therefore it is anticipated that considerably less recycling will be rejected going forward. Preparations are ongoing to enable the rollout of a kerbside sort method of recycling. It is anticipated that this will reduce the costs currently being spent on treating recycling however the rollout will be phased from around Autumn 2019 therefore the full benefit will not be achieved in 2019/20.
- 2.4 There is also currently a pressure of around £100k on the staffing budget at Barry Island. Due to the popularity of the resort additional resources have been utilised to maintain the expected cleanliness standards of the beach and promenade.
- 2.5 In addition there is a projected adverse variance against the street lighting energy budget. Although efforts have been made over previous years to turn a high % of street lighting to LED there have been significant increases to the cost of energy. The cost has increased by 13% in 2018/19 and now a further 9.5% in 2019/20. There is therefore a projected adverse variance of £150k against this budget.
- 2.6 The Directorate is being requested to look at ways of mitigating a projected overspend however, it is anticipated that reserves will have to be utilised to balance this budget in the current financial year.

- 2.7 Regeneration This budget covers the Countryside, Economic Development and Tourism & Events functions. Although the forecast is again shown as a balanced budget at year-end, there remains concern over the long-established income targets for car parking charges and commercial opportunities within the Countryside Division, as these historic savings targets will be difficult to achieve this year if charges are not implemented. Efforts will once again be made to achieve a balanced budget at year-end, but the situation will be closely monitored.
- 2.8 Development Management Fee income remains on track to achieve its target as a number of major applications have been received to date. Staff movement and short term vacancies whilst the recruitment process takes place has resulted in an under spend on staff costs. In addition, the Division is also continuing to pursue the use of Planning Performance Agreements and other streams of income generation such as pre-planning application advice to help support the regulatory process, in line with 2019/20 savings targets.

2019/20 Savings Targets

2.9 As part of the Final Revenue Budget Proposals for 2019/20, a savings target of £1.076m was set for this Committee. The £600k Reshaping Services savings target, set for Neighbourhood Services, has now been allocated into specific projects. A target of £32k has been set for Single Use Sports Facilities and this project is being reported via the Healthy Living and Social Care Scrutiny Committee. This therefore now brings the total savings target for this Committee to £1.044m. Attached at Appendix 1 is a statement detailing all savings targets for 2019/20. Neighbourhood Services and Transport are projecting that they will achieve around half of their saving target. Updates on progress will be provided to members during the year.

Capital

- 2.10 Appendix 2 details financial progress on the Capital Programme as at 31st August 2019. The following changes have been made to the Capital Programme since the last report to Committee.
- 2.11 Ogmore by Sea/St Brides Major Sustainable Transport Improvements Delegated authority has been used to increase this capital scheme by £50k using sustainable transport S106 contributions received from the developers at Ogmore Residential Centre and Ogmore by Sea Caravan Park. This scheme comprises numerous sustainable transport schemes throughout Ogmore by Sea and St Brides Major to improve infrastructure for pedestrians.
- 2.12 Local Transport Fund The Council has been awarded a £85k Welsh Government grant via Merthyr Tydfil Council for 2019/20. The grant has been awarded in relation to the Barry Docks Interchange and must be fully spent by 31st March

- 2020. It has been requested that the 2019/20 Capital Programme be increased by £85k.
- 2.13 Improve Pedestrian Movement along Treharne Road As part of this budget, £20k had been allocated to provide the Vale Adaptive Cycling Club with 3 specialist adaptive cycles: Electric Duet Wheelchair Tandem Cycle, Electric Side X Side Tandem Cycle and Tomcat Special Needs Bullet Trike, to meet the needs of their beneficiaries. However, the club have now been awarded a Strong Communities grant to fund this equipment. It has therefore been requested that the 2019/20 budget is reduced by £20k. The remaining £120k of this budget will be spent on footway and public transport infrastructure improvements in the area around the former Maes Dyfan School.
- **2.14** Maendy Pedestrian Sustainable Transport Improvements It has been requested that this scheme is renamed 'Ystradowen Sustainable Transport Improvements' as a result of land ownership issues.
- 2.15 Welsh Water Bonvilston Improvements Delegated authority has been used to increase the 2019/20 Capital Programme by £1.049m to pay Welsh Water Dwr Cymru to undertake reinforcement works in Bonvilston. These works are to be funded from s106 monies.
- 2.16 Economic Stimulus within Local Authorities The Council has been awarded a £769K grant from Welsh Government to invest in capital schemes to drive important changes in communities. The schemes must provide economic benefits which are aligned with the Welsh Government's priorities. Meetings are being arranged to discuss the allocation of this funding. It has been requested that the 2019/20 Capital Programme is increased by £769k.
- 2.17 Hood Road Goods Shed Land Payment The Council is in a legal joint venture (JV) with the Welsh Government relating to land at the Innovation Quarter. In accordance with the JV any income generated from the sale of land is split between the two parties based on a percentage ratio, which is determined by the level of development expenditure both parties have invested to date into the Innovation Quarter. It has therefore been requested that the 2019/20 capital programme is increased by £62.37k to allow a payment to be made to Welsh Government for their part of a capital receipt received by the Council.
- 2.18 High Street/Broad Street Traffic Management This scheme is complete, and it has therefore been requested that the remaining £13k budget is removed from the capital programme.

3. How do proposals evidence the Five Ways of Working and contribute to our Well-being Objectives?

- 3.1 The revenue budget has been set in order to support services in the delivery of the Council's Well-being objectives. It is therefore important for expenditure to be monitored to ensure that these objectives are being delivered.
- **3.2** The revenue budget has been set and is monitored to reflect the 5 ways of working.
- **3.3 Looking to the long term** The setting of the revenue budget requires planning for the future and takes a strategic approach to ensure services are sustainable and that future need and demand for services is understood.
- **Taking an integrated approach** The revenue budgets include services which work with partners to deliver services e.g. Health via ICF.
- **3.5 Involving the population in decisions** As part of the revenue budget setting process there has been engagement with residents, customers and partners.
- **3.6 Working in a collaborative way** The revenue budgets include services which operate on a collaborative basis e.g. Shared Regulatory Service, Vale Valleys and Cardiff Adoption Service.
- 3.7 Understanding the root cause of issues and preventing them Monitoring the revenue budget is a proactive way of understanding the financial position of services in order to tackle issue at the source as soon as they arise.
