Report Title:	Revenue and Capital Monitoring for the Period 1st April 2021 to 31st January 2022
Purpose of Report:	To advise Scrutiny Committee of the progress relating to revenue and capital expenditure for the period 1st April 2021 to 31st January 2022

Policy Framework:	This report is for executive decision by the Cabinet
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Executive Summary:

- The revenue position for 2021/22 will be challenging with the continuing pressure for the service both operationally and financially as a result of the COVID 19 pandemic. This will impact both as a result of incurring additional expenditure but also from a loss of income. Funding has been provided by Welsh Government to cover some of the issues.
- An efficiency target for the year has been set at £162k.
- The capital budget has been set at £17.822m this financial year.

Recommendations

1. That Scrutiny Committee consider the position with regard to the 2021/22 revenue and capital budgets.

Reasons for Recommendations

1. That Members are aware of the projected revenue and capital outturn for 2021/22.

1. Background

1.1 Cabinet on 22nd November 2021 approved the revised budget for 2021/22.

2. Key Issues for Consideration

Revenue.

- 2.1 Neighbourhood Services & Transport is currently projected to have an adverse variance of £1.5m against the 2021/22 budget. Funding for budget pressures of £642k was provided as part of the 2021/22 budget setting process, however, there remains considerable pressure on the budget. Efficiency savings of £146k were also set as part of the 2021/22 budget which the service is currently trying to identify however due to the current budget position this is proving difficult.
- 2.2 The Council has been notified that WG is issuing an additional £50m RSG across Wales in 2021/22, which is to be utilised to offset expenditure in year which was to be funded from the Council's own resources. An indicative figure of £2.040m has been provided for the Council and the funds should be utilised to support flexibility in managing pressures, this year or in the future. It is therefore proposed that £1.5m is used to fund the projected overspend in Neighbourhood Services.

- 2.3 Waste Management – As previously reported the budgets within Waste Management are under severe pressure due to increasing costs over the last few years and is the main contributing factor for the large projected overspend within Neighbourhood Services. To combat this upward trend in costs the recycling collection service has been changed to a source separated method of collection. This collection method is considerably more labour intensive than the previous co-mingled collection however it has helped the Council to reduce the amount being paid for treatment of co-mingled recycling as most source separated materials can be sold to the market, rather than paying for expensive treatment. Until Penarth and Dinas Powys are also introduced onto the scheme there will remain an element of this costly co-mingled recycling. There also remains pressure on employee and transport budgets due to downtime involved in travelling to Cardiff to dispose of residual, food and green waste and travelling to Cowbridge to offload source separated recycling. Overall vehicle costs and downtime should reduce once the waste transfer station is operational which is currently due to take place during 2022/23. It is proposed that the projected overspend of £1.5m for this financial year is mitigated by the additional RSG funding provided by WG.
- **2.4** Building Services The Building Maintenance service is currently projected to breakeven.
- 2.5 Regeneration Countryside income remains adversely affected by the pandemic as school trips and other larger gathering events are slow to recover. It is however anticipated that these losses can once again be recovered from WG to the end of this financial year. The corporate events programme has also been reviewed considering the pandemic and though many regular events have not been possible to proceed, other events such as the Vale of Glamorgan Festival of Flowers and the Big Beach Build were supported.
- 2.6 Development Management The Development Control team remain busy working through a high number of planning applications. There is currently a high turnover of staff within the Division and the extensions of temporary student planners are assisting with continuity. Preparation work is also underway for the next Local Development Plan (LDP) any costs exceeding the policy budget for the LDP will be drawn down from the LDP reserve at year end. As such there is currently no variance to budget to report.

2021/22 Efficiency Targets

As part of the Final Revenue Budget Proposals for 2021/22, an efficiency target of £162k was set for the Committee. Attached at Appendix 1 is a statement detailing all efficiency targets for 2021/22. Each savings target has been given a RAG status. Green indicates that it is anticipated that the target will be achieved in full within the year, amber indicates that it is considered that the saving in the

- year will be within 20% of the target and red indicates that the saving to be achieved in year will be less than 80% of the target.
- **2.8** It is anticipated that the Neighbourhood Services targets will not be met this year.
- 2.9 There still remains some issues within the Waste Management services regarding achieving historic savings and the financial impact has been outlined in the relevant section.

Capital

- **2.10** Appendix 2 details financial progress on the Capital Programme as at 31st January 2022. The following changes have been made to the Capital Programme since the last report to Committee.
- 2.11 Caerleon Road Footpath The Council has agreed to implement a new pathway on Caerleon Road, to access a new play area being installed. Delegated authority has been used to include this scheme in the Capital Programme with a budget of £2,000 in 2021/22, and £122,411 in 2022/23 to be funded using \$106 monies for sustainable transport.
- 2.12 Penarth Marina Land Slip Works In order to complete phase 1, a further £32,415 is required for the car parks works. This quote includes for the replacement of 250m of fencing including new posts, removal of all materials from the ditch and repairs to the existing rock netting including taking down and replacing the close boarded fencing to the Dock car park. Due to the urgent nature of the works emergency powers have been used to increase the Penarth Marina Land Slip Works budget by £32,415 in the 2021/22 Capital Programme which is to be funded by a contribution from the Policy revenue budget.
- 2.13 Metro Enhanced Framework (MEF) Scheme The Council has been awarded a grant of £100k for the Vale of Glamorgan MEF scheme from the Metro Plus Programme 2021/22 through Merthyr Tydfil County Borough Council. This funding is to carry out a WelTAG 1 Study. The primary purpose of the WelTAG 1 is to set out the case for change (Strategic case) for the priority corridors, identify the key strategic journeys within the study area, identify a short list of options for priority corridors. The expected outcome is a recommendation of short-listed option/s or packages of options to be taken forward to WelTAG 2 leading to the delivery of infrastructure improvements. Emergency powers have been used to include this scheme onto the 2021/22 Capital Programme to be funded from the grant detailed above.
- 2.14 Neighbourhood Services Highway Improvements The Council has been awarded additional general capital grant in 2021/22 of £2,702,921. This funding is unhypothecated to give authorities the maximum flexibility however the award letter does state that one area that local authorities have specifically highlighted

as an area of pressure is the maintenance of the existing highways network. Emergency powers have been used to increase the Neighbourhood Services Highway Improvements scheme budget by £500k in the 2021/22 Capital Programme to be funded from additional general capital funding. The remainder of the additional general capital funding will be allocated as part of the Final Capital Proposals report.

- 2.15 New Household Waste Recycling Centre (HWRC) The land purchase will not be complete by the end of the financial year as land negotiations are on-going and there is a need for planning permission. It has been requested to carry forward £350k into the 2022/23 Capital Programme.
- 2.16 Barry Island On-Street Parking Restrictions It has been requested to include a budget of £35k in the 2021/22 Capital Programme for on street parking restrictions at Barry Island. This work has already been completed however should be classified as capital. This scheme is to be funded by a revenue contribution from the Highways budget.
- 2.17 Vehicles Renewal Fund It has been requested to bring forward £196k from the 2022/23 Capital Programme into the 2021/22 Capital Programme. The Council have been able to take early delivery of stock. With shortages and delays in delivery it is prudent that this is undertaken to allow older vehicles/plant to be replaced.
- 2.18 Dinas Powys Sustainable Transport Works will be undertaken following the demobilisation of the developer on site. This work will not be carried out in 2022/23, it has therefore been requested to carry forward £191k into the 2022/23 Capital Programme.
- 2.19 Local Nature Partnership Grant Further funding of £45k has been awarded to the Council due to an underspend in the Welsh Government grant allocation and organisations were asked to submit proposals for further capital purchases / projects. After consultation with officers in relation to the biodiversity projects undertaken annually, it was decided that the purchase of a remote controlled mower would be beneficial, as it would enable steep sided banks normally inaccessible to be maintained and managed for the benefit of biodiversity improvement. Emergency powers have been used to increase this scheme budget by £45k in the 2021/22 Capital Programme which will be funded by a grant from Welsh Government.
- 2.20 Cosmeston Works Programme No tenders were returned for this scheme; therefore, the works will not progress this financial year. It is anticipated that this scheme will go back out to tender in the new financial year. It has been requested to carry forward £120k into the 2022/23 Capital Programme.

- 2.21 Central Promenade Café Roof, Barry Island The work was anticipated to commence in January however having inspected the roof space in more detail it has been concluded that this work would require full access to the building and more specific design details from a structural engineer. The work will now be carried out in 2022/23. It has been requested to carry forward £50k into the 2022/23 Capital Programme.
- 2.22 Cowbridge Livestock Market Regeneration Budget Ongoing works to the site are required next financial year, it has therefore been requested to carry forward £22k into the 2022/23 Capital Programme.
- 2.23 Penarth Heights Public Art A contractor has been appointed for the historic shelter scheme and consultation is underway. The scheme will continue into 2022/23 and it has therefore been requested to carry forward £80k into the 2022/23 Capital Programme.

3. How do proposals evidence the Five Ways of Working and contribute to our Well-being Objectives?

- 3.1 The revenue budget has been set in order to support services in the delivery of the Council's Well-being objectives. It is therefore important for expenditure to be monitored to ensure that these objectives are being delivered.
- **3.2** The revenue budget has been set and is monitored to reflect the 5 ways of working.
- **3.3 Looking to the long term** The setting of the revenue budget requires planning for the future and takes a strategic approach to ensure services are sustainable and that future need and demand for services is understood.
- **Taking an integrated approach** The revenue budgets include services which work with partners to deliver services e.g. Health via ICF.
- **3.5 Involving the population in decisions** As part of the revenue budget setting process there has been engagement with residents, customers and partners.
- **3.6 Working in a collaborative way** The revenue budgets include services which operate on a collaborative basis e.g. Shared Regulatory Service, Vale Valleys and Cardiff Adoption Service.
- 3.7 Understanding the root cause of issues and preventing them Monitoring the revenue budget is a proactive way of understanding the financial position of services in order to tackle issue at the source as soon as they arise.
