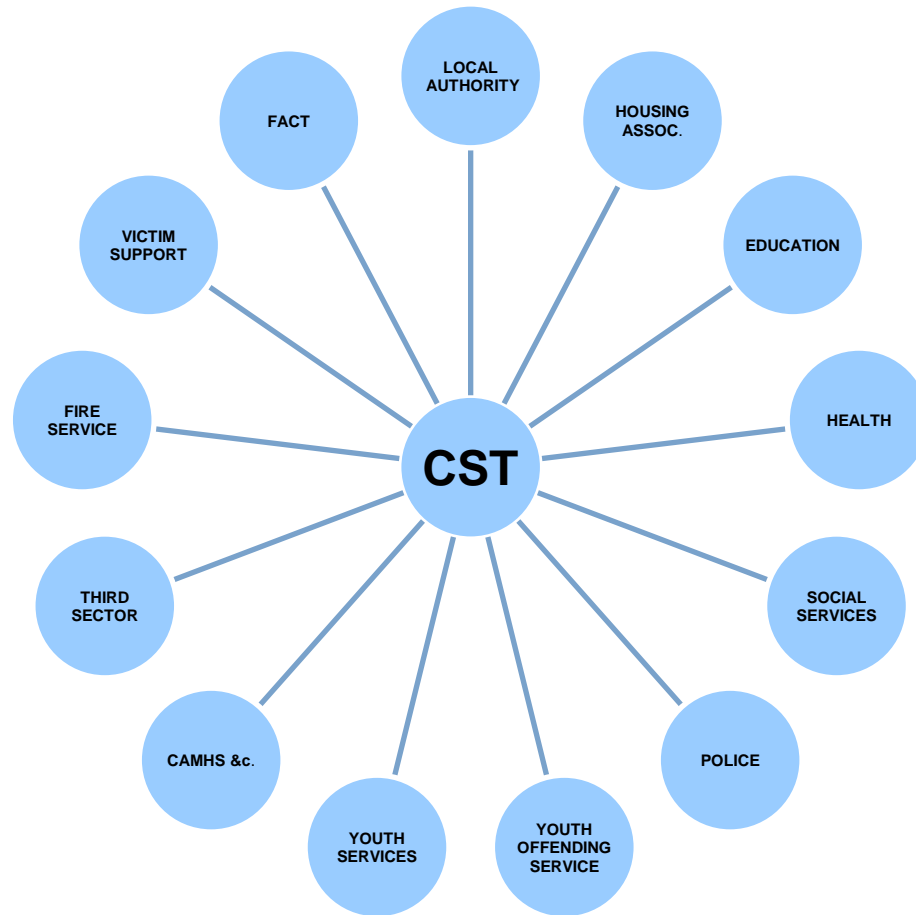

Prevention focus

Prevention is a key part of reducing crime and ASB, the right support such as appropriate housing and mental health support that can be offered to individuals at the right time is crucial to the individual.

ASB 4 process

The Safer Vale team operate a four stage process when dealing with incidents of ASB.

Stg 1 Warning Letter

Stg 2 Multi agency Visit

Stg 3 Anti Social Behaviour contract

Stg 4 Consideration for legal proceedings

Joint working

- The Community Safety team are located at Barry Police Station
- South Wales Police and Community Safety work jointly when dealing with ASB.
- Access to the Police system
- Link between all Council services

Joint working

Youth Offending Service (YOS)

The community safety team work closely with the youth offending team when dealing with the young people that cause ASB in the Vale.

The aim is to look at prevention and ways to engage the young person. As part of this intervention that is offered Neighbourhood Resolution Panel (NRP) is offered to the young person as part of the ASB process. The NRP is conducted by a 1 Partnership Officer and 1 YOS Officer with a YOS volunteer.

Joint working continued

Vale Housing and RSL's

All housing related ASB is now met with a joint response from the CST and the housing providers. This will include joint visits where further support can be offered and information on how these behaviours can affect tenancy. All issues are attempted to be resolved before taking any punitive action.

- Premise Closure Order (PCO)
- Police Dispersal Power (PDP)
- Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPO)
- Community Protection Notice (CPN)
- Community Trigger (CT)
- Civil Injunctions (CI)
- Criminal behaviour orders (CBO)

How the powers have been used

- Llantwit major Criminal behaviour order s
- Community Protection Notice, Sully, Barry
- Premise Closure Order, Cardiff Road, Barry.
