Executive Summary:

- To apprise Members of the agenda for the meeting of the National Standards Committee Chairs Forum to be held remotely on 27th January, 2025.
- To receive a verbal update from the Chair of the Vale of Glamorgan Council's Standards Committee following attendance at the Forum meeting.

1. Background

- 1.1 In September 2019 Committee were apprised of the Terms of Reference and overview of the work of the North Wales Standards Forum and the feedback received regarding establishing a Standards Forum in South and East Wales.
- Lack of resources and capacity were raised as barriers to establishing a similar Forum in South and South East Wales at that time. However, since then discussions have been ongoing for the establishment of a National Forum.
- 1.3 In March 2021 the then Minister for Housing and Local Government announced her intention to commission an independent review of the Ethical Standards Framework for Local Government (ESF) in Wales that was established by the Local Government Act 2000. Mr. Richard Penn, an independent consultant, was subsequently commissioned to undertake the review.
- 1.4 The Standards Committee considered at its meeting on 25th November, 2021 a report on the first phase of Richard Penn's review of the Ethical Standards Framework in Wales. In the first phase review Richard Penn suggested that an all-Wales Forum for Chairs of Standards Committees be established and that the Annual Conference for Independent Chairs and Independent Members of Standards Committees across Wales be re-established.

2. Key Issues for Consideration

- 2.1 The National All Wales Standards Committee Chairs Forum is a body for the sharing of good practice and the co-ordination of activity. The Forum is not a formal decision-making body and does not have delegated powers to act on behalf of the Standards Committees in Wales.
- **2.2** Members will recall that Committee was keen to be part of an all-Wales Forum.
- 2.3 The WLGA send out the agendas, prepare minutes and prepare basic reports analysing practice across Wales with the agenda for the meetings being prepared

- by the Monitoring Officers Group with Members of the Forum being able to suggest items of future business.
- **2.4** The agenda for the meeting to be held on 27th January 2025 is to include the following items -
- Pam Lucas Local Government Policy Division, Public Services and Welsh Language Group, Welsh Government.
 - a) Ethical framework review position update.
 - b) Standards Committee annual reporting arrangements.

- Matters raised by exception by the Chairs.
 - a) Have other Authorities signed up to the <u>SLCC | Civility & Respect Pledge</u> and / or encouraged their Town and Community Councils to do so

 - a) Recent cases of interest Adjudication Panel for Wales (APW) and Public Services Ombudsman for Wales (PSOW) in previous 6 months.
 - b) Hearings Opportunity to share experiences in a safe learning environment.
